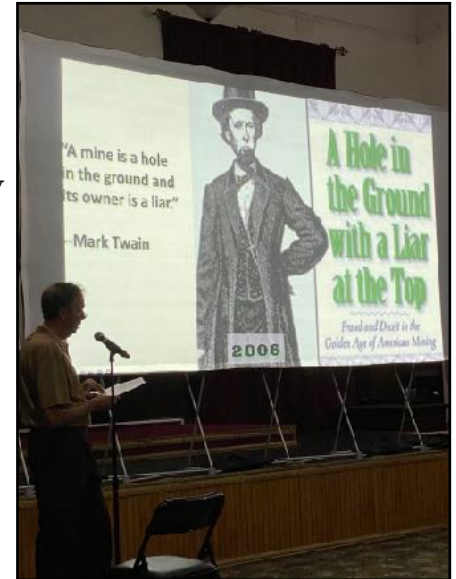

Meet at the Colfax Railroad passenger depot at 8:45. Wear sturdy shoes, bring water. It is a level trail.

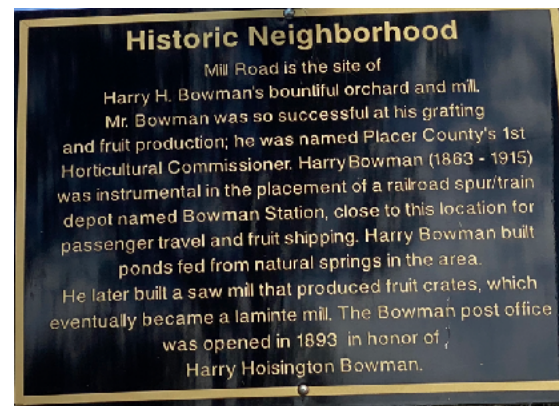
