

# QUONG HI & CO.

## **160 & 164 Sacramento Street**

- 1864 – Thomas and Pat Shanley owned the property here. Thomas was a farmer.**
- 1880 – The Shanleys sold the property to Hung Dun, Quong Fook Hing, Sam Fun and Dan Fing**
- 1887 – The Chinese partners sold the property to Simon and Mary Betton and they erected a brick building.**
- 1890 – The Bettons rented the building to Lee, Watters and Smith for their cigar factory.**
- 1892 – The Bettons rented the building to merchant Quong Hi for his general merchandise store. Quong Hi had a store here and one in Hong Kong. He was one of the few Chinese to travel extensively back and forth from China.**
- 1899 – Tuey Wong was hit with a hatchet by Sim Oye in the cellar of Quong Hi's building. It was rumored to be an opium den.**
- 1910 – Ma li took over as manager for the Quong Hi Company. He was known for his annual Chinese New Year dinner celebrations.**
- 1940 – Frank Betton sold the building to Fay Wong.**
- 1983 – Awful Annie's Sandwichery moved in.**
