- 1855 John Van Mater, the tinsmith, had a shop here before the fire. He and several others replaced the wooden buildings here with these brick buildings.
- 1858 Julius Brooks opened a Bank and Exchange office here. He also ran the Alta Express and the Alta Telegraph service.
- 1861 Brooks' clerk, Albert Gamble, bought him out. Gamble ran the telegraph and also assumed the duties of the postmaster for the town.
- 1873 Michael Hoffman and George Eddy opened a butcher shop.
- 1877 Gridley Lewis bought the building here, made some improvements and brought the post office back to this site in 1878.
- 1879 James Willis and Ashael Huntley ran the post office and a book and variety store here. Huntley would later be elected County Sheriff.
- 1892 Frederick S. Stevens, the postmaster and druggist, bought the building. He installed the post office boxes that are currently in the building.
- 1895 Mrs. Louise Huntley owned the building.
- 1906 Thomas James bought the entire block.
- 2019 The post office has been in continuous operation at this location for over 140 years.
