

226 Washington Street

- 1851 George Keehner had an early merchandise and liquor license.
- 1855 Keehner's Bakery was destroyed in the fire that wiped out most of Old Town.
- 1856 Keehner had his new bakery and confectionery store up and running, it was called the Eagle Bakery.
- 1863 Keehner's Eagle Bakery building was destroyed by fire again but he rebuilt.
- 1869 Keehner bought the Empire Livery next door from Johnny Stanton.
- 1871 Keehner sold the Empire Livery to Jacob Neff.
- 1874 Keehner kept his hand in mining and had a claim in Dutch Ravine.
- 1880s Keehner seemed to have more of a saloon than a bakery here.
- 1893 Keehner sold the saloon/bakery here to Gibson and Flowers, they were the proprietors of the Putnam House Downtown.
- 1900 George Keehner died, his widow Caroline kept the saloon open.
- 1905 The saloon was destroyed by fire and Caroline Keehner died.
