- 1851 – George Keehner had an early merchandise and liquor license.**
- 1855 – Keehner's Bakery was destroyed in the fire that wiped out most of Old Town.**
- 1856 – Keehner had his new bakery and confectionery store up and running, it was called the Eagle Bakery.**
- 1863 – Keehner's Eagle Bakery building was destroyed by fire again but he rebuilt.**
- 1869 – Keehner bought the Empire Livery next door from Johnny Stanton.**
- 1871 – Keehner sold the Empire Livery to Jacob Neff.**
- 1874 – Keehner kept his hand in mining and had a claim in Dutch Ravine.**
- 1880s – Keehner seemed to have more of a saloon than a bakery here.**
- 1893 – Keehner sold the saloon/bakery here to Gibson and Flowers, they were the proprietors of the Putnam House Downtown.**
- 1900 – George Keehner died, his widow Caroline kept the saloon open.**
- 1905 – The saloon was destroyed by fire and Caroline Keehner died.**
